## Fall Flying


#### Sheridan Air Service Changes to SkyWest

## Recreational Aviation Foundation Column>>> By Lori Olson

The Recreational Aviation Foundation (RAF) was founded by a group of pilots sitting around a campfire lamenting the fact that a lot of places conducive to airplane camping were being threatened or closed. The RAF is dedicated to maintaining and preserving existing strips for recreational use and is involved in identifying new fields for access. An example of their early work is Ryan Field located near Glacier National Park in Montana.

Wyoming State Liaisons, Lori Olson (Upton) and Chris McAtee (Casper) work to identify similar strips in our state. In May of 2018, Wyoming RAF, and EAA Chapters 420 and 342, joined forces to work on the first Wyoming RAF strip, Miracle Mile, located between Pathfinder and Seminoe Reservoirs. This field is perfect if you like fishing the Miracle Mile section of the North Platte (photo below). The campground and fishing access is a short walk from the strip.

August 7,2019 - U.S. Transportation Secretary Elaine L. Chao Announces \$9.7 million in Infrastructure Grants to Three Aiports in Wyoming
